As I gazed around the room I noticed many of the bikes were polished to perfection. I struck up a conversation with a man called Thumper who must be near 70. He was perched upon a stool watching his wife polish his Harley trike. He said to me "I'm old school. I don't clean my bike unless I just hit it with a cloth while she (his wife) is getting ready for us to ride somewhere." In the same rueful tone he said, "None of these other guys are Old School." His statement wasn't degrading. His voice had a hint of sadness in it...like he missed the old days. Thumper, by definition, is the epitome of "Old School "

On January 25th the Oklahoma biker community lost an Old School biker named Johnny Cook. To his friends he was simply known as Old Man... well, because he was an old man. I had known of Old Man for many years, and had spoken to him several times in passing. I had even chased his club around Tulsa one year during one of their annual Up Runs. But it

wasn't until the last six months of his life that I finally got to sit down and listen to some of his stories. Old Man wasn't a 1%er - he was a 100%er, and his stories reflected the way he lived and rode. I am sorry I did not have more time with this man.

Nothing beats an Old School Biker when you need one. When the fender struts broke on my '93 Harley FXR I couldn't find them in any biker bling catalog, on Ebay, at any Harley shop or anywhere else. Ted the Mechanic took my bike and made the struts with his own hands in a shop resembling my grandfather's workshop back in the 1960s. Being able to repair a motorsickle with nothing but hard work and ingenuity is Old Skool Cool!

These Old School bikers are like the motorcycle on the front cover of this issue. They are to be treasured and revered. These men rode hard, partied hard, lived hard and loved hard. They understand what biker brotherhood is about. They rode bikes made in America by Americans. They are the reason we ride Harleys and Indians today. They are legendary and bigger than life – like the motorsickles they rode!

Formerly known as "Colorado Motorcycle Show & Swap." This is billed as the largest indoor swap meet in the country, and I think it lives up to that title. It has always been the last Saturday in January (although it's a Sat. & Sun. event). I try to go every year; I think I have only missed one in the last twelve years or so. Don't get me wrong, I don't go for parts and accessories, although I used to (I ride late model stuff now days). I go to socialize with friends I only get to see a couple of times a year. I find it truly amazing how far folks will travel just to go to a swap meet.

The Colorado Motorcycle Expo is one of the largest motorcycle events in the country! It's several motorcycle events rolled into one weekend. The CME includes: the Country's Largest Indoor

Motorcycle Swap Meet with over 800 booths; a huge Bike Show featuring about 125 exquisite vintage bikes and top of the line customs: a Wet T Shirt Contest, Live Music, Onsite Tattooing & Piercing, and more! It is held at the National Western Complex in Denver, iust whoever thought of having a winter motorcycle event in Denver. Since I live in the warm tropics of Oklahoma (as compared to Denver in winter), I have never rode to this event, I usually take a car to the event. I can tell you even in a car, the trip is an event in itself, sometimes rain, freezing rain, ice, snow, and even a "Sasquatch" sighting 1 year! Parking, now that is a story in itself, unless you come in groups of about 10 in a VW, parking is difficult, but not impossible. The building itself is huge, 4 levels and each level about the size of a football field. If you go and cannot find a part, you just did not look hard enough! By midday, the crowd is elbow to elbow, and moves around like a herd of snails, which give you plenty of time to "window" shop. This year, I showed up at the Expo about 10am, and as usual, by about 1pm it was packed. Although its inside. the weather is important, this year, morning was cold and clear, but by 5pm was cloudy and trying to snow. Sunday morning when I arose, it had snowed about 10 inches overnight. But after a few delays, I finally made it back to Tulsa safe, and somewhat sound. This is a good trip to break up the winter, even if you have to fly or drive, it's a biker event, and in the winter those are hard to find.

Exploring Oklahomawith Two Tone



Way up north in central Oklahoma is the town of Newkirk; they have a jewel of a BBQ restaurant. Don't get this place confused with the normal smoky and dirty BBQ joint, as it has the family dinner appeal. The Stagecoach Bar-B-Q sits on the north side of Highway 177 as it doglegs through town, and you'll be hard pressed to find parking after Church lets out.

The impression we got was, "oh boy we'll be waiting a while," but that wasn't the case at all. They had plenty of cozy seating for our group of six, road weary and hungry bikers. The staff greeted us and took our orders promptly, and within ten (10) short minutes of absorbing the rustic, country dinner atmosphere our food arrived hot and fresh.

I can't say enough about the staff; even the owner Vance stopped by our table to greet us and asked if everything was ok. Of course it was except they had run out of chicken, so it must be good. (*There is no bologna*

on their menu.) We all tried different meats and found the Hot links spicy, ribs served dry with Head country and Stagecoach sauces on the side. My brisket was sliced perfectly with a nice bark and smoky flavor as well. The sides are hard to rate, as everyone enjoys them differently, such as Cole slaw and potato salad. I found their slaw fresh, crunchy and sweet but not too sweet as if you were eating a desert. Apparently the potato salad was bland, I didn't try it but perhaps this was the local favorite; you'd have to judge that I suppose.

Our route was long, windy and chilly. However, it was well worth the ride NW through rural Oklahoma, via county roads and across the vanishing, old overhead suspension bridges across the beautiful Arkansas



River; and through the farm and ranchlands that fill the area.

Our group left from Haskell, and Tulsa meeting another group from Claremore in Hominy. We headed west to Ralston on 20, and saw the larger than life cutouts of the American Indians on their famous plateau in the town of Hominy. West of Ralston we took a county road west and then north to Highway 60 and then west to highway 177 in Ponca.

This trip was a perfect way to share time, food and of course the ride with friends. We absolutely had a blast without stopping at any of the bars along the way. So if you are looking for something new try the Stagecoach BBQ in Newkirk.

Beauty is in the eye of the beholder and some parts are beautiful works of wall art without any modification at all.

As I am writing this article, a program on television is featuring

a "biker-themed restaurant/bar". The decorator has just created a chandelier from gears and chains. Absolutely elegant without being too girly. The possibilities are endless. So, before heading out to the next swap meet, check out www.pinterest. com or one of the many do-it-yourself programs to spark your imagination.

With a sense of adventure, patience and a trained-eye, you can ferret out the object of your desire. Swappers can spend hours rummaging through vendors' wares seeking the rare, obscure, and highly prized. With a poker-face and well-honed negotiating skills, you can haggle or swap your way to a great deal.

Is Your Motorsickle Ready for the Road

You've been planning and looking forward to that first great ride of the year. If you winterized your bike after your last ride before storing it away, you'll spend less time getting it ready to go in the spring. What could be worse than experiencing a problem on the road that could have been avoided by spending just a couple of hours getting your bike springtime road ready?

I spent a little time visiting with Donny Meador at Kinetic Playground. Donny gave me the following advice and overview of the parts and systems that need to be checked and taken care of before hitting the road.

Battery – if you did not start your bike all winter or properly preserve your battery over the winter, charge it overnight. If it does not pull a full charge, buy a new one.

Did you know...Batteries lose 1% of charge per day when not being charged or used? That's 90% of its charge gone in 90 days!

Charging system – make sure your charging system is working properly. Even a brand new battery will fail if your charging system is not doing its job.

Fuel – for maximum power, performance and fuel economy use only 100% gasoline. You can find a comprehensive list of stations offering 100% gasoline at www.puregas.org. If your fuel was not properly stabilized over the winter, drain the tank and start fresh. If your tank was not full, drain the tank and check for rust before filling up.

Ethanol woes! Ethanol fuel is very corrosive to your motorcycle's tank, filter, carburetor, fuel lines and anything else it comes into contact with. Ethanol fuel separates in as little as 21 days.

Spark Plug – depending on the type of bike you have, a spark plug may or may not be an easy roadside fix. With that in mind, you might consider changing your spark plug before hitting the road.

Air Filter – visually inspect your air filter. Hold it up to a light source. If you can't see light through the filter, clean it or replace it. A dirty air filter restricts the oxygen flow that your engine's combustion process requires to run your bike.

Tires – this is literally where "the rubber meets the road." Visually inspect your tires for proper tread, cracks, flat spots. If you see exposed wire or metal meshing, it's definitely time for a replacement. If everything looks good, check the tire pressure and make sure they're properly inflated.

Belt or chain – take a few minutes to inspect your drive belt or drive chain. A broken belt or chain can strand you on the side of the road. Now is also a good time to verify the tension to make sure it is up to the manufacturer's specifications.

Lights – stay safe on the road by ensuring that your signal lights, brake lights and headlights are working.

Horn – honk it once every day so that it will work when you need it.

Brake pads – visually inspect your brake pads. Maybe more important than the systems and parts that keep you going, you want to know that your brakes will stop you when you need them.

Hydraulic fluid – regardless of your mileage, change your hydraulic fluid every 2 years.

Coolant – again, regardless of your mileage, change your coolant every 2 years.

Oil & Oil Filter – check your oil and filter. If you didn't change your oil and

filter before winter storage, start your spring off right with fresh oil and a clean filter.

Wash, Wax & Polish – that's right, thoroughly clean your bike and it will look as good as it runs and you'll look good riding it!

Riding Gear – the only thing protecting your hide from the pavement. Make sure it's in good condition.

Finally, it's time to ride! Start her up and get the juices flowing and up to temperature.



This rant is going to be more information than a rambling by me. We're coming up on that time of the year when most are chomping at the bit to get out and ride (the rest of us have already been out and riding). There's a few safety things I'd like to hit on that might save you and your bike. If you've had snow or ice, beware of the sand/gravel build up at the bottom of hills and at intersections. Sand tends to collect at the bottom when the rain

washes it down the hill and if there is a turn or a stop at the bottom of the hill, things can get loose and out of control pretty quick. Not only can it cause you to lose control and lay it down, but you can also slide right out into oncoming traffic. Let's also not forget about the sand and other crap that builds up along the center divider and sides of the road. Anyone, anywhere that gets caught behind a Big Truck is going to get sand blasted. This is a bad deal if you don't wear a full face or goggles.

Did your bike sit idle all winter? You might want to check that battery to see if it's charged. I recommend a battery tender if you don't ride much (I really recommend riding, but hey, what can I say). They keep your battery crisp and ready to go when you do decide to take your bike out. Look the tires and belt over, check for tire rot and cracking, trend depth and tire pressure, look for loose lugs on the belt and frays. This is easy stuff to do and can save you a breakdown on the side of the road. Get some good gas as soon as you can, chances are that's the same gas in the tank that has been in there all winter. Check your lights, make sure they work be-

cause the Cops sure like to use that as a reason to pull you over.

Let's talk about a new law that popped up down in Texas. It's a law that took effect on January 1 and may be of interest to motorcycle enthusiasts, it's called Malorie's Law, and it's the final piece of HB3838 passed by the 83rd Legislature, which requires hand-holds and foot pegs on bikes designed to carry passengers.

The new law states the following:


MOTORCYCLE FOOTRESTS AND HANDHOLDS REQUIRED. A motorcycle that is designed to carry more than one person must be equipped with footrests and handholds for use by the passenger.

I've spent at about a half a day re-reading the law and doing research to try to find answers and I am shocked at how vague this law is. I received no advance notification from any agency that this was going into effect and it just popped up Jan 1st.

What concerns me is the fact that the Texas DPS (Highway Patrol) can't tell me anything about this or specifics that apply to motorcycles registered

in other states. This bill does not even cover what is considered to be handholds. Upon initial contact with the Texas Department of Public Safety, a spokesperson for them stated that the new law would "not be interpreted by just one agency, each agency may interpret it differently." That sure sounds like a bad deal for riders. I've never been a fan of Cops having the right to decide how they interpret the law, I always seem to lose that battle. My other question to them was how does it apply to bikes tagged in Oklahoma? They don't seem to know the answer to that question either. So, beware, hand-holds for your passenger are required in Texas, I think, maybe, depends on who pulls you over!


