"One day at a time" is more than just saying, it's a way of life and thank God He and others that loved me, TRULY LOVED ME, helped me find my way out of that dark painful pit that kept me in denial for so many years.

I've never really talked about my sobriety birthdays before other than in meetings or with personal friends and loved ones, but I thought 20 years clean from dope was worth sharing. Being an entertainer it was very easy to obtain anything I wanted or needed dope-wise for at least half of my career.

Free is free, didn't matter what it was, I ingested it &/or snorted it. Like they say "them damn they sayers" 10 ft. tall and bullet proof. I trafficked, I carried guns, I was a full blown outlaw going and hanging with people I should have NEVER been associated with. I was one "probable cause" pull over from being in prison when I finally got a clue. I had to separate myself from "playmates, play things, play places" to really get my footing to a better life. It was hard staying away from these things, especially in the world I had become accustomed to.

It wasn't easy getting clean, but five years of meetings; every single day, and sometimes 3 times a day; working at a rehab for 5 years, then just pulling my head out of my ass and realizing that my priorities and my GOD were more important than one more bump or bumpy ride.

I found my way back by the Grace of God, which by the way I never lost sight of...I just tried to drive my own life instead of handing Him the wheel. Now here I am, 20+ years clean!!! I still think about it

sometimes. I still wonder how I ever took that road to hell. BUT, I made it back to Heaven in one piece and I'm still kicking dirt on the top part of the ground today. My career is great. My kids are great. I'm someone's grandma times 3; I have a beautiful home and wonderful husband I NEVER thought I'd have in my life.

I'm rich; not in money, but in love and life. Positive begets positive and I don't entertain negative thoughts or negative thought patterns anymore. No more pitiful me. I look for my miracle everyday and if I don't find it, I keep looking because I wasn't looking hard enough the first time. Forgive yourself, let others forgive you or not; but say your sorry's and keep it movin'. I did my part, that's all that matters. It's a selfish program so let the chips fall where they may. Some will come back around, some won't, some don't need to and cannot enter my world ever again. I'm okay with that, so they need to be too.

So, here's to my next lifetime of clean living. Thank you to my blood family and my Fort Smith family for putting up with me. You were all there for me as I took this step into my reality life that was always there waiting for me to come home to. The words I remember most was my mom saying "welcome back." Amen & Hallelujah; IT WORKS IF YOU WORK IT, ONE DAY AT A TIME!

#### Bikers according to ...

Well it will have been seven months since "Waco" by the time this is printed. Any idea as to what's going on down there? Don't feel bad or uninformed; I don't think anyone knows what's going on in Waco.

Gag orders, appeal of gag orders, appeals of appeal of gag orders — where does it all end? Or, as far as we know, where did it all begin? Again, don't feel bad or uninformed; I do not think anyone knows! Confederation of Clubs meetings have been going on for many years, and never before has there been an ordeal like what happened in Waco. As long as I can remember COC's were considered safe and orderly meetings. A meeting where ALL bikers could go for information.

Just one week before the Waco incident. bikers from all over the United State came together for a National Coalition of Motorcyclists Meeting (NCOM) in Denver. This NCOM meeting we held without incident. At the time. I am sure the folks in Texas thought it was a great idea to have a meeting with a central location to discuss what was talked about at Denver a week earlier. Since everyone did not have the opportunity to go to the Denver NCOM, this would be convenient opportunity to share information from the Denver NCOM meeting. It then reminds me of a song by "Dago" called "Unbreakable". The song begins something like this "It was just an

ordinary day...then dark forces began to play."

What happened next? You will just have to use your imagination because facts on the event are scarce. There has been some highly edited video "leaked." Law enforcement says they did not leak it and Attorneys say they did not leak it. It really does not matter who leaked it, it shows little about what happened in Waco, and what sparked it off.

Most of the actual information we have comes from Vehicle Forfeiture Affidavits. That forfeiture thing opens up a whole new set of rules. Did you know even if every biker charged in Waco is found innocent, the State of Texas may still keep the vehicles?

By filing forfeiture on the vehicles the presumption of innocence goes away. In other words, if charges are filed on an individual he or she is innocent (or suppose to be) until proven guilty. But by charging the vehicle, it is forfeited unless you can disprove what the State says. The rules are reversed, and only six states have laws prohibiting this forfeiture. Texas is not one of them. Oh well, like they say, "Texas" it's a whole 'nother Country.

All that can be done at this point is to sit back and hope the wheels of justice turn in the right direction.




