

TALKIN TRASH

It seems like yesterday I was in my teens dashing around after marijuana and trying to find someone to buy me a bottle of tequila from the liquor store. My twenties were a little different. I fell in love with drugs. I purchased injectable steroids and drugs from a doctor (now deceased) in Pryor, under the guise of giving them to my Rottweilers. Folks, I became a junkie, sticking needles in my arms several times daily.

I didn't care about much back then. If you had something I wanted I took it by theft or force. If things didn't go my way I was extremely violent. Serving seven years in prison tempered my violent nature and my drug use. After my release from prison, I continued using drugs recreationally and I used alcohol every day for the next 15 years. On January 21, 2010, I woke up from a blackout in a state park near Wagoner. I was homeless, in a stolen car with the windshield broken out, and I only had \$400 to my name.

Let me say this, "people getting sober can be really mean to people they love and care about." Folks, remember, in my earlier years I was a full-fledged junkie, injecting drugs into my body daily. Then, I was a hardcore alcoholic drinking until I passed out almost daily.

About this same time, I started reading a book called *Basic Instructions Before Leaving Earth*. I left *The Current* and started printing Oklahoma

Biker again. Our little Ragazine flourished, and soon we were getting national recognition from the National Coalition of Motorcyclists. More than 90 motorcycle clubs, associations and organizations, thru the Oklahoma Confederation of Clubs, endorsed us as the Official Motorcycle Magazine of Oklahoma. Our success enabled us to buy a home, motorcycles, other businesses and so much more.

I say this not to sound boastful. That book I began reading called Basic Instructions Before Leaving Earth has an acronym. The acronym is The BIBLE. Whether you believe in God or Jesus, when you start reading The BIBLE isn't as important as vou read it. What is important is that you apply what you read in *The BIBLE* to vour life. Doing so will completely change your life for the better. I doubt many of you has lead a more dreadful life than me. Your past does not have to equal your future. Ask for forgiveness. Forgive yourself. Live the life you were meant to live when God created you.

End note: Barlow Publishing quit printing *The Current*/ *Currentland* last summer.
We hired most of their former staff members, and are now publishing a new magazine entitled The Current BUZZ. Please watch for it and let us know what you think. Our tattoo magazine is on hold while we work on this new project.

A Ninja on the Streets

Let's talk about the motorcycle on the cover of this month's issue. The Kawasaki Ninja H2. At first glance, this bike took my breath away when I first laid eyes on it at Daytona Bike Week in March. I couldn't stop thinking about it. I needed this bike, so I could go on living a fruitful life. Just kidding.

The H2 is one of the most beautiful (beauty is in the eye of the beholder) and technologically advanced scooters built for the street today. Everything about this bike was designed and built by Kawasaki Industries from the Motorcycle division to their Aeronautics group. The H2 is a limited production (like 300 units per year) supercharged "Hyper-Bike." This

bike has no equal in the industry today as a complete package. This first production supercharged motorcycle created cranks out 210 h.p., and 98.5 lb-ft of torque and weighs only 525 pounds. And that, folks, creates a very fast bike (I believe it is electronically limited to 203 mph). The body is sleek, designed by the aerospace guys to be slippery and create a mountain of down force. This bike was painted Mirror Silver with an amazing clear finish that imparts glass for its reflectivity, and it is stunning.

If you see a streak go by, it is not Flash from Marvel Comics. It's me riding my Kawasaki Ninja H2 and reliving my youth. God Bless America!

Now that I am free to walk as I please, I find myself limping along exactly as if I were still in the walking cast/boot. If I try to walk normally, the way I walked before the wreck, it hurts all up and down my leg. I have trained my body to walk in a certain way to accommodate my ailing appendage and this stubborn body of mine has accepted that as

law. Now trying to go back to the way it is supposed to be is literally a pain in my butt...and back and leg. My body is used to walking wrong and trying to make it right is difficult and painful but as it turns out, my ankle is healing stronger than before.

Does this sound familiar? It should. Many people find themselves so far engulfed in a less than satisfying lifestyle - that trying to find



one's way out is also difficult and painful. We can train ourselves to live a certain way and when we see a way out of that life it seems too difficult and painful to follow through. But it is not. Where's he been since his stint at Myers-Duren? And how can you get him to perform a magical healing ritual on your ride? We found the (not really) elusive Victor McAnally, (not) hiding in plain sight in a shop of his own (Mac's) right in Tulsa. The magic man of motorcycles has opened his own shop with his son Tylor and this duo is ready to turn your treasured bike, trike or four-wheeler into anything you want. If you can dream it, they can build it, but they can also take your ride even further than you ever imagined. They have the technology. And the parts. And the know-how.

Victor named 'Mac's' after his grandfather's Triumph shop (Victor's dad's machine shop is still in operation in Tulsa, but that's a story for another day). He opened Mac's because motorcycles are his world and his ancestry (we think he bleeds motor oil). He started racing bikes in his early teens and has never been too far from a bike in his life. Tylor was riding dirt bikes from the age of two (and he DOES bleed oil), and they are the perfect pair; Victor knows the old school riders who want to make the Bat Bike go to 11 and Tylor understands the newer riders who bring in a rusty frame, three bolts and a tire and want a new something, but have no idea what that is just yet. They have that magical bond that others may never understand.

Judging from all the giddy smiles leaving the shop (and all the bikes in the shop awaiting their touch), they must have some sort of magic, right? No. It's a





very spiritual experience to talk bikes with Victor; he doesn't spend much time talking about himself (all the cool bits hanging on the walls speak to his history for him), but he knows the story about every bike (and owner) in his shop. As he walks through, he runs his hand along each bike as he tells its story; he knows the bike is an extension of the owner; each one special because the McAnallys understand that affection. Victor has accounts with just about every parts company out there, he utilizes one of the best detail painters in the state and he does his own powder coating and chroming. With 20 years working in the service center at Myers Duren, this ain't some dude who changed the oil on his bike once and now thinks he can work on your baby. These guys are the real deal. And their rates are uber-competitive. Best part of all - they care. A LOT. Your bike's health is everything to them and you'll know this as soon as you walk through the door. This is serious bike repair for serious bikers.







