5th Annual Washita Memorial Motorcycle Run '17

The Washita River Massacre occurred on November 27, 1868 when Lieutenant Colonel George Armstrong Custer attacked a sleeping band of peaceful Cheyenne living with Chief Black Kettle. This winter encampment was on reservation soil under protection of Fort Cobb, and was even flying a white flag to demonstrate they were actively avoiding conflict. It is estimated more than 150 people lost their lives that horrible day.

Amos Tallbear, Henry Sleeper, and several others decided to pay homage to the loss of those lives by hosting the Washita Memorial Motorcycle Run. This run is not like any run you have ever been on. It is not meant to excite and feed your fun, but rather to feed your soul. It is a very personal and spiritual event that will leave you humbled and somewhat sanctified. The purpose is to honor the men, women, and children that died at the hands of Custer's troops.

The 5th Annual Washita Memorial Motorcycle run will begin at the Lucky Star Casino in Concho, Oklahoma. Reg-

istration is \$10 per bike and starts at 8:00a.m. K.S.U. at 9:30, even though all wheels and all ages are welcome. There will be no bar stops or alcohol served during this event. It is meant to educate the public and to show respect to not only the deceased, but to their descendants as well. It is a time of reflection and will leave you solemn and enriched. It is a relaxed, laid back, and peaceful way to share a piece of Oklahoma history that changed many lives forever.

Runs will include a visit to the Washita Museum with a free guided tour, 50/50 tickets, door prizes, t shirts, patches, breakfast at registration, dinner at last stop, a trip to the edge of the battle-field at the Pavilion, and will end at the Washita Battlefield in Cheyenne.

Regardless of your ethnicity, I challenge you to attend this run. It is an experience rather than an event. You will definitely not leave the same as you came.



It's really sad that there are STILL so many animals that have no people to love, because that's all most dogs and cats want, yet it's made worse when we have shelters overflowing with animals and animal control agencies are restricted in where they can go by geography or funding, but there are people who go out and gather up abandoned cats and dogs, clean, feed and transport them to other states where the need for pets exceeds the number available for adoption. They also spay and neuter and offer pet training.

All of this costs money that government agencies don't contribute much to, so it is truly a labor of love. Peaceful Animal Adoption Center (PAAS) is a local group leading the charge to help local dogs and cats find new homes, and they are hosting their SECOND Poker Run on Oct. 7 to help Oklahoma's homeless furry friends. Last year's Run was so fun, they've "UPPED THE ANTE" (get it?) for 2017. There are gift certificates for dinner for EIGHT at Big Creek Ranch (with a Clydesdale drawn carriage ride), a bunch of biker accessories and memorabilia. a helicopter tour of Grand Lake and some even bigger goodies that we hear might include a week-long beach trip to Venice Beach, Florida, but we won't say for sure.

PAAS Shelter is located on 628 Wilson Street in Vinita and they are always accepting donations. They are a 501c3 organization, so your contribution can be tax deductible. The Run starts at 10 a.m. at the PAAS store in Vinita (last bike out at 11 a.m.) and last bike finishes by 4 p.m.

Be sure to check out their website blog; the stories are sad, happy and sweet, but after you read stories of animal perseverance, you quickly learn that we ALL deserve love. And treats.


















TURNER / BOGGS 2ND ANNUAL SUICIDE AWARENESS RUN


Poker hands are \$20 for the first hand



BIKES, BLUES & BBQ ARKANSAS' BEST BIKER EVENT

It was just a few years ago when Bikes Blues and BBQ didn't even have a name; it was just a poker run with a BBQ grill, a blues band, and a handful of bikes at a Dickson Street Jose's Mexican restaurant. Then it became America's fastest growing rally, and then the world's largest charity rally, and now suddenly, it's been 18 years.

Bikers come from all over and fill every hotel and motel with in a 30+ mile radius. Others decide to camp all weekend regardless of primitive conditions.

At BB&B you can expect a parade, a bike show, bike give-a-ways, the BBB Babes contest, incredible barbecue, of course, along with several other official and non-official events. The party seems to never end and really comes alive at night on Dickson Street. Live bands take turns playing amazing music all the way to Eureka Springs.

Last year a record of \$230,000 was raised for local charities despite a slight decline in attendance. Normal attendance is between 350,000 and 400,000 although it's nearly impossible to calculate the actual numbers since it has become so popular and widespread.

BB & B has been going strong since 2000 and takes place every year, usually the last weekend of September. This year the rally date is set for Sep-

tember 20-23. People generally book their rooms a year in advance so if you can't get a hotel, the event is only a few hours away from Tulsa. Many bikers show their support, even if it's just for the day.

If you have never attended Bikes, Blues, and Barbecue, I highly recommend it. While you are there, purchase an event tee shirt. Every time you wear it, no doubt someone will engage in conversation with you sharing their own personal memories.




