

I was amazed at how good the sandwich tasted as the ingredients served to counterbalance oneanother, creating an equilibrium of flavors and texture. The Caesar Salad consisted of classic ingredients: crisp Romaine lettuce, creamy Caesar dressing, croûtons, and grated Parmesan cheese. A honey yogurt sauce covered strawberries, apples, and grapes in the Fruit Cup. Portions were such that we felt full without being stuffed. Perfect for lunch!



Left Turn Arm and hand extending left, palm facing downward.



Right Turn Arm out, bent at 90 degree angle, fist clenched.



Slow Down Arm extended straight out, palm facing down, swing down to your side.



Follow Me Arm extended straight

up from shoulder, palm forward.



Single File Arm and index finger extended straight up.



Double File Arm and index and middle finger extended straight up.





Turn Signal On Open and close hand with fingers and thumb extended.



Pull Off

Arm positioned as for right turn, forearm swung toward shoulder.

Stop



Arm extended straight down, palm facing back.



Speed Up

Arm extended straight out, palm facing up, swing upward.



You Lead / Come Arm extended upward 45 degrees, palm forward pointing with index finger, swing in arc from back to front.



Hazard in Roadway

On the left point with left hand; on the right point with right foot.



Comfort Stop Forearm extended, fist clenched with short up and down motion.



Refreshment Stop Fingers closed, thumb to mouth.



Cops Ahead Tap on top of helmet with open palm down.



Fuel Arm out to side pointing to tank with finger extended.


This song was written 500 years ago in a time when church goers were forced to sings dark and somber songs in Latin. There was little joy to be had in the church even at this time of year when we were supposed to be celebrating the Savior's birth. To combat this, the downtrodden and oppressed people would write and sing their own songs. God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen became a favorite for Christmas. The translation of two words in that song make a world of difference in the understanding of what they were singing about and what we should be singing about. These words were written and understood in early modern English, which was the language of the common people of that time. (this would be the language that Shakespeare wrote in) This means that the two words rest and merry did not mean what they mean to us today.

Rest translates to make or keep and Merry really means mighty. (You didn't think Robin Hood's Merry Men meant they were happy, did you?)
