Oklahoma native Gary Nixon is one of the most colorful riders in American Motorcyclist Association history and also one of the most successful in the AMA Hall of Fame. In a 20-year pro racing career, Nixon scored 19 AMA National

victories and earned the coveted AMA Grand National Championship twice. At the time of his retirement in 1979, he was the AMA's sixth all-time win leader and ranked third in road race victories. Although the majority of his 19 national



wins came on pavement, Nixon also was beyond doubt one of the fiercest and most competitive dirt-track racers of his era.

He began his professional career in 1958 at age 17, and won the Oklahoma State Scrambles Championship that year. After paying his dues for several seasons, he broke into the national limelight with his first AMA Grand National Series victory in 1963. That same season, he made his first appearance among the AMA's top 10 riders and he remained in that elite company.

In 1966, he was runner-up in the AMA point standings. Then, in 1967, he guaranteed himself a spot in the history books when he logged a personal best five national victory and captured the AMA's coveted No. 1 plate.

The 1968 season was one of the most competitive in AMA history and Nixon scored just two wins. But consistency carried him to a successful title defense by a narrow nine-point margin over a brilliant young Harley-Davidson rider named Fred Nix (also from Oklahoma), who led the series with six victories.



In 1973 and 1974, he won AMA National events for both the Kawasaki and Suzuki factory teams. But his career very nearly ended at midseason in 1974 when he suffered multiple injuries during a testing session in Japan.



Nixon was back with a vengeance in 1976, contesting the World Formula 750 Road Racing Series. But a controversial ruling by the world governing body cost Nixon the championship.

He officially retired in 1979, yet Gary Nixon remained visible as a team manager and has even made an occasional return to the saddle, most notably in BMW Legends events (where he won at Daytona in 1995) and in the 2002 AMA Dirt Track Grand Championships.



# HARLEY ECM PASSWORD LEARN PROCEDURE

When installing a new ignition or ECM on a security-equipped Harley there is a "Password Learn" procedure that must be performed. This applies to all Twin Cam and V-Rod models with factory security but may also apply to Twin Cam's with EFI. The TSM/TSSM and ECM have "learned" passwords that synchronize the control module with several other components. Once you remove a component from this chain the module shuts down and won't start. This is reported to only occur with EFI models but the new 2004 carbureted models demonstrate the same shut-down when changing the ignition module. Once you have installed the ignition module and reconnected the battery, perform the starting sequence as normal. The





engine will cough once in an effort to start but will fail when the module shuts off the fuel. Special Note: During the Password Learning procedure the ignition will remain in the "On" position for an extended period of time (30+ minutes). While "On", power is supplied to the headlight thus draining the battery. If the battery charge drops below a certain level during the Password Learn procedure the process will cease and you will have to start over. To avoid this connect a trickle charger to the battery throughout the procedure.


## TSM/TSSM ECM PASSWORD LEARN PROCEDURE

Step	Action	Confirmation	Notes
1	Set Run switch to Run.		
2	Turn ignition key ON-OFF-ON-OFF-ON-OFF-ON and then toggle the Left Turn Signal switch twice.		
3	Turn Ignition key OFF-ON.	Verify the Check Engine lamp and Security Lamp illuminate briefly and then turn off.	Security lamp will not illumnate on non-security (TSM) Twin Cam models.
4	Attempt normal start one time.	Engine starts and stalls immediately. Check engine lamp stays on.	Password has not been learned and sets trouble code P1009, thus stopping fuel flow.
5	Wait 10 seconds	Security Lamp remains lit for V-Rod and TC-88 with TSSM. Lamp will not be on for TC88 TSM models.	ECM enters Password Learning mode for 10 minutes. Do Not cycle the ignition or disrupt power.
6	Wait until Security Lamp turns off or a minimum of 10 minutes has passed.

12	Turn Ignition switch OFF. Wait 15 seconds. Turn Ignition swith ON and start engine to confirm the Password Learn Procedure is successful.	Engine will start and remain running. If engine immediately stalls and fails to restart, the Password Learning mode was not successful. Start over at Step 1.

The **Oklahoma Biker** magazine booth received a lot of visitors wanting to pickup the latest issue and a few of the past issues that they had


the past issues that they had missed. Thank you to all who stopped by to say "hi", and chat about how we were doing, what they liked, and what they wanted to see in future issues.

# Teaching Big Rig Drivers to "See" Motorcycles





Most people agree that big rig drivers are well trained, professional, safe drivers. With the demand for big rig drivers so high, in 1969 Central Technology Center (Drumright Campus) began offering one of the first higher-education, commercial truck driver/CDL training programs in Oklahoma.

ABATE of Oklahoma recognized that while there are not many big rig vs. motorcycle collisions each year, not one was a "fender



bender". Every big rig vs. motorcycle collision resulted in motorcyclist fatalities or severe injuries. ABATE of Oklahoma developed a program to teach big rig drivers how to better "see" and coexist with motorcycles. Several years ago, Central Tech added Share the Road's motorcycle awareness training to every driver training class.

ABATE of Oklahoma developed specific motorcycle awareness training programs for car and light truck, school bus, and big rig drivers. These programs address the visibility (or "motorcycle invisibility") problems of the respective vehicles. The programs also address stopping and acceleration distances, how weather affects motorcycles, the importance of the entire lane to a biker, ways to improve seeing us, mirror and A post blind spots, and other reasons why drivers fail to see motorcycles. The Share the Road program is a video presentation with instructor narration and lasts about 20-25 minutes. All presentations are made at no cost.

I recently had the opportunity to join Roger Bryant, Share the Road instructor, at one of his Drumright truck driver training sessions. Roger is an experienced driver, trainer, and motorcyclist. Big rig driving experience is not required to be an instructor, but it did help Roger communicate with the students.

Central Techtraining includes safety, CDL requirements, night driving, loading and loaded truck handling, backing, and inspections. Students must be 18 years old or older to take the 23-day course. The course has such a respected reputation that trucking company recruiters meet with the classes and most students have jobs when they graduate. The Central Tech Truck Driver Training course was the first course in Oklahoma to be certified by the Professional Truck Driver Institute (PTDI), meeting stringent skill, curriculum, and course/ program standards.



# Here's the HEAT!!

The goal?? How to keep heat from becoming an issue while we are wanting to **RIDE!!** 

Motorcycle specific gear provides not only protection from the road or flying objects, it can provide protection from the elements as well.

Cooling vests, mesh jackets and pants, vented helmets, wicking shirts, etc.

Wearing moisture wicking base layers keep us cooler as the day heats up.


Let's start with helmets.
 Multiple vents (especially with exit vents) make wearing a helmet MUCH cooler than not.

allow to reach your skin with the added confidence of being protected as well.



 Textile gloves: These also provide protection while allowing air to flow freely around our hands while they are doing the work of controlling the motorcycle.









 Cooling vests: There are several different varieties of these. Or you can wear a cooling towel around your neck as you ride as well.



There are also several things you can do to help your gear:

- Stay HYDRATED! This is NOT coffee, tea or alcohol. All of these drinks speed up dehydration. Which is NOT what we want.
- Take BREAKS while riding!!
   Don't be afraid to go slow and take more cooling breaks out of the heat to allow your body to cool off. Try not to

ride during the hottest part of the day.


- Wear moisture wicking clothing. Don't leave skin uncovered. It speeds up dehydration and doesn't help to cool our bodies while riding.
- Another option is to try using a camel bak – These are the small "backpacks" that can allow you to drink while riding (Plus, they keep your back cooler with chilly water in them!)



All of these make our riding cooler, safer and more manageable during these **HOT** months of **SUMMER!!**

According of the US Census Bureau, Oklahoma has the eight largest percentage of veterans (9%) in their state's population. When the veterans enlisted, the government promised them a lifetime of quality health care. There is an expanding need for medical facilities in Oklahoma, but the vets have been under served. Congress failed to release badly needed funds for the Oklahoma VA, until several years ago. As a result of improved funding, soon Tulsa will be able to significantly increase medical services to veterans.





Out With the Old and In With the New

**Ernest Childers Outpatient** Clinic. located on 41st St has been the main VA medical center in Tulsa. The new Ernest Childers VA Health Care Center, a much larger facility, is located at 8921 S. Mingo Rd, Tulsa. The 91st St and Hwy 169 location will be easy to access, and is close to the South Creek Medical Center. The health care center's 22 acres include almost 1,000 parking spaces. Parking was always a problem at the old location on 41st St. The new facility has more handicap parking than

the Muskogee hospital and 10 times more handicap spaces than the Tulsa Clinic. With over 180,000 square feet, the facility has new services such as chemotherapy, infusion clinic, endoscopy, mammography, and expanded support services including: audiology, addiction and substance abuse treatment, dental, laboratory, mental health, MOVE! weight management, optometry, pharmacy, physical therapy, primary care, prosthetic and sensory aids, radiology, rehabilitation and recovery center, social work, specialty care clinic, suicide prevention, telehealth, women's clinic, 19 waiting areas, 21 reception stations, 5 offices for Veteran Service Organizations and a Veterans Canteen Service retail store and food court

### **New Downtown Hospital**

In December 2020, President Trump signed a law approving \$120 million in federal funding for a new Veterans Hospital in Tulsa. The hospital will be located in downtown Tulsa at 7th and Houston Avenue, on the expanded OSU Medical Center Campus. The project will convert the existing Kerr-Edmondson Buildings into a modern 275,000 square-foot, 58-bed medical-surgical hospital for veterans.



More than two-thirds of the 47,000 veterans who receive services at the current Jack C. Montgomery Medical Center in Muskogee come from the Tulsa metro area. Of the 115,400 + veterans in the Eastern Oklahoma VA area, approximately 68% are closer to Tulsa than to Muskogee, leading planners to estimate the new hospital could serve up to 30% (or 14,000) more Oklahoma veterans annually.

This expansion allows the VA to repurpose the Jack C. Montgomery VA Medical Center in Muskogee into a much needed community living and behavioral health center with expanded services that are not currently offered in



this area. Many of the staff that we talked to at Jack C, Montgomery said they were planning on transferring to the new hospital when it is opened in 2024.

A number of veteran motorcycle clubs are members of the Oklahoma Confederation of Clubs (CoC). These veteran clubs assist and provide comradery for veterans, whether they ride or not. 




If you get bitter, you will only slow the entire process down and bring unnecessary misery upon yourself. If you choose to get better, all of Heaven will back you up and you will come shining through.


