a British motorcycle known for its reliability and toughness. Unlike its sportier rivals, the Panther focused on practicality, making it a favorite for families and sidecar use.

This focus on utility helped Phelon & Moore, the Panther's maker, survive the Great Depression and other economic challenges. While many motorcycle companies went bust, P&M's strategy of



building simple, dependable machines kept them afloat.

The Model 100 itself was a testament to this approach. Its engine design saved weight and the lubrication system minimized leaks. It wasn't the fastest bike, but it could handle heavy loads and keep running for years with minimal maintenance.


P&M also offered smaller, cheaper bikes like the Red Panther, which helped them stay in business during lean times. They even faced expulsion from an industry group for selling such an affordable motorcycle!

Despite some forays into sportier models, Panther remained focused on practical bikes for everyday people. This strategy, combined with Yorkshire frugality and sound engineering, allowed them to thrive where others failed.

The Model 100 became known as the "Aspidistra"

of motorcycles, a tough and reliable machine that just kept going, much like the nearly indestructible houseplant. It remained in production for over 40 years, a testament to its enduring popularity.





Have you heard about Honor Flights? This organization offers flights to Washington D.C. military memorials to WWII, Korean War and Vietnam War Veterans. There are no expenses to the Vets. Priority is given to World War II, Korea and terminally ill veterans from all wars.

Veterans are escorted to Washington, D.C. by Guardians who are responsible for the well being of the Veteran for the entire day. Often a family member takes up this honor. On the return flight, Vets receive mail call packets containing cards and letters from their families, friends, school kids and strangers.

Volunteers and donations are urgently needed. It takes over 1300 volunteers' hours just to get one flight airborne. Help is needed in many areas including: pre-flight operations, fundraising, speaker's bureau,

communications, logistics, and clerical tasks. This is a labor of love, no one is paid.

The Oklahoma Warriors Honor Flight is part of the national Honor Flight Network. They have taken over 650 Oklahoma Vets on these "thank you" flights.

Their needs are so great, that they had to postpone their April flight for lack of resources. Do you think you could give a little to this extremely worthwhile group? Here are a few suggestions.

On April 4th Frenchy Marnne', Richard Beal, Randy Knox from ABATE of Tulsa; Andy Steiberger & Rob Coulter of CMA Tulsa; "Memphis" and friends from DBA OKC attended this court hearing. Cabral plead a "blind plea". A blind plea is a guilty plea without a set sentence. A blind plea is different from a standard plea bargain where the prosecuting attorney recommends a lighter sentence. The judge will now cast sentence.








Let Someone Know when You Can't

As independent riders, we need to be aware of how to make our contacts known to first responders, whether they be professionals or not, in case of a wreck or any other emergency.

We have a responsibility to those whom we need to contact! This is a safety factor and something you should consider while riding motorcycles or not.

I use several techniques. I wear dog tags, I have emergency contacts on my phone and I use Life360.

I LOVE for people to know where I'm located because I'm

usually having fun and in case I'm not, I may need some help!

ICE (In Case of Emergency) notification is easy to add to your phone.

How to Add Emergency Contacts to an Iphone

- 1. Open the Health app and tap on your profile picture
- 2. Tap Medical ID
- 3. Tap Edit, then scroll to Emergency Contacts
- 4. Tap the Add button to add an emergency contact
- 5. Tap a contact, then add their relationship
- Tap Done to save your changes

How toAdd Emergency Contacts to an Android

- 1. Open the Settings app
- Scroll down and tap Safety & emergency. This menu can be found in the Advanced Settings menu on earlier versions of the Android (Android 11 and earlier)
- 3. Tap Emergency contacts
- 4. Tap Add Contact

5. Select emergency contacts from your contact list

If your phone is attached to your bike you may become separated from it and need a more immediate physical identification! You may want to use one or more of these ideas.


- Road ID tags that slide onto watch straps
- Dog Tags to wear around your neck
- Apps on the phone like Life360 are helpful as well
- Notes in your pockets may seem old school, but, they help in a pinch





BEEN THERE, DONE THAT!

The old saying "it's not if... but when you are going to drop or crash on a motorcycle"... may be true. Yes, I ride and have been for over 40 years. Yes, I have dropped bikes and have been in two wrecks with significant injuries. It happens.

Most recently, I was "T-boned" (as my friends keep calling me) by a young lady driving a Hyundai while attending Sturgis this past August. It was my last day of the rally. Yes, I know the naysayers are out there, but a buddy and I hauled our bikes out the prior week and were returning home the next morning.

We had just eaten a late breakfast at the Savoy area of Spearfish Canyon and were heading toward Deadwood from Lead. I was going into Deadwood while my riding buddies were heading on to Needles Highway (I had ridden Needles earlier in the trip and had not made it to Deadwood yet).

I remember seeing the Hyundai, stopped at the stop sign to my right, as I continued on Highway 85 into Deadwood. I then turned my attention back to the road in front of me and the next thing

I remember is her hitting me on the right side of my road glide. I was catapulted across her car about 10-15 feet onto the asphalt. Later, I learned my road glide had spun and took out two more bikes heading the opposite direction.

This young lady did not have near enough insurance to take care of 3 totaled bikes and 3 injured people. Fortunately, I have Uninsured/Underinsured insurance. This coverage is helping get my medical bills paid as well as compensating me for my injuries where her insurance could not.

What is Uninsured Motorist Coverage?

When you are involved in a wreck like mine that is not your fault, and the other driver

- 1. does not have liability insurance; or
- 2. does not have enough liability insurance to cover the medical bills for your injuries, or anyone's injuries in your car at the time of the accident; or
- 3. is a hit-and-run driver; then your uninsured motorist coverage on your vehicle insurance steps in to help with medical bills.

Motorcycles

Oklahoma law allows the uninsured motorist policy on your car or truck to cover you on your motorcycle - even if you rejected the uninsured motorist coverage on your bike - so long as you have liability insurance on your motorcycle with the same company.

As a Passenger

Even more, your uninsured motorist policy covers you as a passenger in someone else's vehicle.

Are You Covered?

How do you know if you have uninsured motorist coverage? Easy! Check your insurance declaration page or call your insurance agent. If you are not covered, you can always add it to your policy for the same amount as your bodily injury liability coverage. Yes, it will add to your premium, but it is well worth the peace of mind knowing you are entitled to some relief when the at-fault driver is not. Never let anyone downplay the importance of uninsured motorist coverage.
