





THE SEASON FOR THE POKER RUN

Summer is here. Time for hard core bike riding, long trips, short runs, it's all good.

I like the Poker runs and we always have plenty of them.

Poker runs are perfect because you ride from town to town but it's not long distance and I get to stop and rest my old back at each stop. Another great thing is you're helping out a kid or downed biker that the run is for and you have a chance at winning some money. Yeah, count me in.

Tips for your next Poker Run.

Days before the run, do a maintenance check on your bike. Riding in a pack of bikes, you don't want to be the one broke down or have you're ol lady falling off the back from a loose bolt in the sissy bar. Last year my gear shifter stripped out and fell loose while going down the highway in a pack of bikes. I made it to the next stop and actually found

someone that had another shifter and gave it to me. Thank You, to that biker! It's great to see bikers helping bikers. Check tire pressure, brake lights, everything. It will save you trouble later.

Eat a good breakfast.

It's going to be a long day and you might forget to eat later between riding and talking to people. Start your motor running on protein.

Hydrate yourself. Most poker runs go from bar to bar. Beer has healthy stuff in it but it will dehydrate you if you're in the sun. Think about a bottle of water as a first choice or second but don't forget your body runs on food and water.

Yes, I know it's a nice hot day but the weather can change. Taking a jacket just in case is always a good idea, I think we have all been down that road before.
